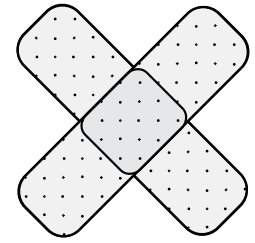


Event: Telcos and the Right to Remedy



Description:

Launching the Access policy paper “[Forgotten Pillar: The Telco Remedy Plan](#),” this event will focus on the right to remedy for telco users. To date, the discourse on business and human rights in the information and communications technology (ICT) sector has studied the second pillar of the Ruggie Framework, respect for human rights. Less attention has been paid to the third pillar on the right to remedy, and to counteracting the adverse impacts on human rights that telcos and other communications operators sometimes contribute to.

This discussion will center on what remedy could look like both in substance and procedure. For example, we will explore the benefits of grievance mechanisms, transparency reports, and other measures that telcos can take to maximize their positive impacts and “know and show” their obligations under the UN Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights.
